1. Call to order at 7:02pm – tried to get all visitors to enter FULL NAME and WHICH SCHOOL their child went to and what grade they were in – many did not comply but we allowed them to stay
2. Welcome to new participants with a general description of the purpose of the SEAB, and a rundown of the agenda.
3. Stephanie shared the report for the School Board under these large categories:
  - a. COVID & Sex Education – yes, we did both!
  - b. Accomplishments
    - i. Elementary – 100% compliant, trainings were completed as necessary, we still need an elementary teacher on the board.
    - ii. Middle – Ensured curriculum/content were consistent at all 4 schools, moved from 6<sup>th</sup> grade to 7<sup>th</sup> grade health course,
    - iii. High – Also had curriculum alignment (including IAM & Mohegan)
    - iv. Advisory Board – Continued through the pandemic, meeting requirements/laws/rules, we have all required sectors represented on the board (teacher/parent ration, students, clergy, health department, etc.), and we have not heard back about presenting at the MDHHS HIV/STI Annual Conference yet. Renai will enquire about status.
    - v. Exciting things ahead – Continue to review materials to ensure inclusive and current using the Community Survey and MiPHY to drive material development, working to support parents by offering evening classes to support their ability to provide sex education at home:
      1. Just around the Corner

2. Raising Sexually Health Children
3. Sexually Explicit Material (exposure, talking about it, affects)

4. The Year in Sex Education:

- a. Stephanie checked with each elementary – all confirmed 100% compliant
- b. Community Education /online courses – A small group of students at Mohegan, Chippewa High and Dakota took the online course. 90% finished with passing grade. Those that didn't had not finished the course mostly for other school-related issues.
- c. Special Education (CLP) Teachers requested materials to share with families. Stephanie will provide a variety of videos that parents can choose from to support.
- d. Middle School – 2 schools are compliant, 2 have not provided all information yet. Stephanie will follow-up. Some students don't get the 10 week course, so Stephanie checks to see what they did or did not get, and how many had parent opt outs.
- e. Training – She checks to see if any teachers have an expiring HIV certificate, has an upcoming course if any need and can offer in the summer as well. Currently all are caught up including new teachers.

5. Workplan:

- a. Trainings – might not need to be a focus if caught up
- b. Parent Notification review = the SEAB will review the note that goes to all parents so that they can review sex ed materials beforehand and agree or not to allow children to attend that part of class. It goes out in newsletters, emails and snail mail if necessary.
- c. Gigantic document that explains it all – Stephanie and Renai will work on filling more of the template from the state out for the SEAB to review and finalize next school year, so it can be on the website and students, parents, teachers, anyone can see in detail how sex education is done at CVS.

6. Votes:

- a. Virtual, in-person or hybrid? Those that voted agreed that we could do virtual at the first meeting and decide whether to continue or meet in a different way depending on COVID and peoples preferences. Passed unanimously.
- b. Are Tuesday evenings still good? No one opposed
- c. First meeting on September 24 or Oct 2? People that voted all said either. Stephanie mentioned that it will likely be for 10/2 to leave a little time for any requests to be addressed.

7. Questions from participants:

- a. Q: Can only teachers request materials/videos? Response: Mostly it is teachers or other curriculum staff that find new materials and request a review. They usually have a feel for whether something will work in class and if there is other material that should be replaced. The SEAB will review for content/quality and if positive move to present to the School Board for approval.

- b. Q: Does the SEAB do district-wide events (example: Transgender Day of Visibility)? R: That would have been a student-organized event. The SEAB does district-wide PARENT education events.
- c. Q: Who is the clergy participant on the SEAB. R: **A pastor** from Trinity Lutheran – Pastor Gary Richard.
- d. Q: What does the SEAB normally do (aside from the year end review)? R: We review materials at the different levels (elem, middle, high), district parent surveys, handling problems that could come up with materials, students, etc. ...
- e. What “Laws” are you talking about” R: All laws for HIV/Sex Education for Michigan can be found on the district reproductive health page – abridged and summaries are available – group was shown via screen share
