TESTING OUT

As we begin scheduling preparations for the 2014-15 school year, we want to share information on the following opportunity that is available to all students. According to the guidelines of Public Act 335, Section 1279B, of the State Code, high school students have the opportunity to “test out” of courses.

The purpose of testing out is to allow students to be placed in higher-level courses in the subject area in which they test out.

To successfully test out of a course and receive credit, students must exhibit mastery of the course content by attaining a grade of 75% or better on a comprehensive final examination. Students may also be required to demonstrate mastery through basic assessments used in the class, which may include, but are not limited to, portfolios, performances, papers, projects and/or presentations. We administer all “testing out” examinations for both semesters of the 2014-15 school year in August. The testing out registration form is now available in the Main Office or on our website under course scheduling. Registration deadline is Friday, May 9, 2014. Exams will occur during the week of August 11th. Time solidified in June when study materials are picked up. If you have further questions regarding testing out, please contact your child’s guidance counselor. Eighth grade students can return completed registration forms and pick up testing out materials at the 9th Grade Center.

FOOD SERVICE DEBIT PROGRAM

Food Service would like to say “Thanks” to all those who participated in our debit program this school year. We hope you found it an easier and quicker way for your students to purchase food.

It is our policy to ‘roll’ all ending balances over for the next school year. However, if your student is leaving the district you will need to request a refund. ***This would particularly pertain to 12th graders who will be leaving the district upon graduation.***

Food Service will provide green “ATTENTION DEBIT USERS” forms to each school office and kitchen. These forms give specific instructions on our refund procedures. CV Student Blood Drive

Blood donation is a safe procedure using single-use sterile needles and supplies. To ensure that student's have a positive experience, we recommend they follow these guidelines:

- Get at least eight hours of sleep the night before their blood donation
- Drink plenty of water prior to the donation
- Eat a healthy meal prior to the donation (preferably with the iron-rich foods such as raisins, fish, poultry, etc.)
- Wear clothing with sleeves that can be raised above the elbow
- Bring a valid identification (such as a driver's license verifying age or a blood donor card)
- Bring a list of medications they are currently taking
- Consider bringing a book or music to enjoy during the donation process

While the donation process is safe, reactions can occur. Most reactions are mild and can include fainting or small bruises. The Red Cross staff is fully trained to work with first-time and younger blood donors, and to respond to any reactions.

Please note that the FDA requires that donors are asked specific questions about their health history. This information helps ensure the safety of the blood donor and the blood recipient. These questions are asked privately and are completely confidential.

Students who are 17 years of age by May 19 and wish to donate may sign up. Students who are 16 years old may donate, but will need to obtain a permission slip. If you are interested in donating please see Ms. Moore or a National Honor Society member after April 15th.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS – 2014:

A student must have earned twenty-two (22) credits by the end of the school year in order to earn a diploma and walk at graduation. This includes all required courses. There will be no exceptions. Seniors will be notified by counselors regarding their status.

SENIOR BEHAVIOR: It is expected that seniors will continue to be a positive influence for the remainder of the school year. Senior conduct in school, the All-Night Party, and graduation ceremonies should leave us with a proud memory of the Class of 2014. We request the support of students, parents, and staff to help us attain this goal.

Week of May 26th – SENIOR CLEARANCE FOR GRADUATION:

Seniors must turn in all books, pay all outstanding fines (main office and library) and turn in all school equipment by the end of the day on Friday, May 30th (Unless a spring athletic team is still in competition). Any outstanding fees/fines not received by then will result in a 'HOLD' on the diploma. Seniors with holds still walk at the ceremony, but no diploma will be issued on Monday, June 9th.

May 28th – 30th SENIOR EXAMINATIONS:

Seniors will attend class for a full day on Wednesday, May 28th with final examinations in their fifth and sixth hours; hours one through four on Thursday, May 29th with examinations during third and fourth hours; hours one and two on Friday, May 30th with final examinations in those hours.

May 30th - Seniors' LAST DAY of school:

All books and equipment must be turned in and fines paid by end of the day. The traditional Senior Class Tailgate Breakfast will take place before school in the West Lot beginning at 6:30am. Project Graduation '14 (the All-Night Party) will take place after school in the Cafeteria from 9:00 pm - 4:00 am. Doors will be locked at 11:00 pm. There will be no ticket sales at the door.

June 4th – SENIOR AWARDS/EPILOGUE NIGHT:

CVHS Auditorium: The event will begin at 7:00 pm. Seniors wishing to participate in the ceremony must be there by 6:30pm and meet in the hallway outside the principal's office. They will line up at 6:50pm to begin the procession into the auditorium. Caps & gowns **must** be worn. No tickets are needed for this program, and family is encouraged to attend.

June 8th – COMMENCEMENT: This year's ceremony will be at Ultimate Soccer Arena on 867 South Boulevard in Pontiac at 10:00am. Seniors must report to Ultimate Soccer no later than 9:00am. They will be directed to the designated staging area of the facility in order to be lined up for processional. Caps and gowns must be worn and appropriate clothing under gowns is required. Girls cannot wear high heeled shoes in the staging area and it is recommended that another footwear option is chosen for the morning. Girls wearing high heels will be asked to take them off while in the staging area. Entrance to the facility and seating for guests with tickets will begin at 8:00am.

PARKING AT Ultimate Soccer: Each graduate will receive one (1) ticket for parking in the primary lot. Therefore, carpooling is highly recommended. There will be ample parking in the supplemental lots which will require a short walk or shuttle bus ride to the facility. As you enter the facility, please follow the directions of the parking attendants and CVHS staff. Parking and the doors to the facility will open at 8:00am for the families and friends of graduates. Please do not arrive earlier because cars will not be allowed in the lot until 8:00am and families will not be allowed to enter the facility until 8:00am. Students will receive five (5) tickets and a layout of the grounds when they pick up their caps and gowns on March 28th during First and Second Hours. Students who wish to apply for more tickets must fill out form. Forms will be available in the Main Office or on the school's website. Completed forms will be due in the Main Office by Wednesday, May 21st. Parents will be contacted the week of May 27th if their respective requests have been accommodated or not.

Please **do not** stand on chairs or approach the stage during the ceremony to take photographs.

June 9th - DIPLOMA PICK-UP: Diplomas, class composite and any awards will be distributed on Monday, June 9th from 11:00am-2:00pm in the auditorium lobby. Seniors who are short on credit, will receive their diploma from the Guidance Department upon completion of summer school. Any holds due to fees must be paid and cleared before a diploma will be released.

A Reminder to Parents: The importance of sleep

THINGS YOU CAN DO AS A PARENT

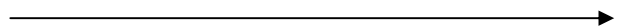
1. **Refuse to supply alcohol** to anyone under 21, including your own child.
2. **Know the laws.** Serving alcohol to minors is illegal and can result in **stiff penalties**, including up to **90 day in jail** and up to a **\$1,000 fine**. In addition, parents **can be sued** if they give alcohol to a teen and the teen is injured in any way.

Taking car keys is never enough!

3. **Be at home** when your teen has a party - and be visible. Make sure that alcohol is not brought into your home or on your property by anyone under the age of 21.
4. **Talk to other parents** about not providing alcohol at parties and other events your child will be attending. Call parents having parties in their homes to determine if the party is supervised and alcohol-free.
5. **Create alcohol-free activities** in your home for your teen and his/her friends.
6. **Create alcohol-free activities** for teens in your community.
7. **Report underage drinking** to local law enforcement officials.
