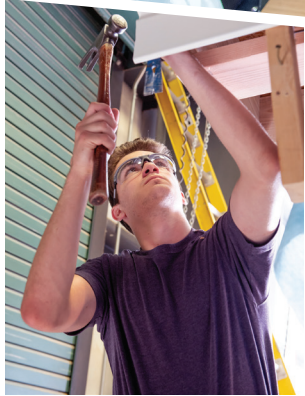


A fiscally responsible proposal

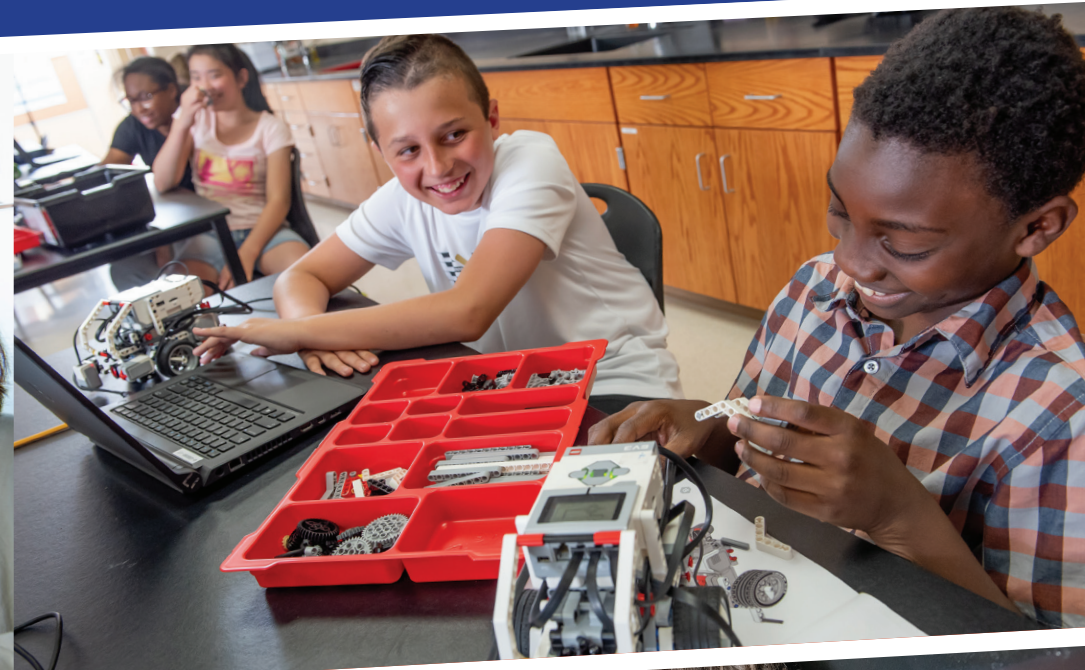

Chippewa Valley Schools by the numbers:

- Every day, Chippewa Valley Schools provides a high-quality learning environment for **16,000 students**, giving them the skills to succeed in college and careers.
- Chippewa Valley Schools maintains a **95 percent graduation rate** — 10 points higher than the state average — and has consistently outpaced countywide graduation rates.
- Fiscal responsibility is a key part of keeping our schools strong. Chippewa Valley Schools has received a **perfect fiscal wellness score** from Munetrix for five years straight, and the **highest possible rating** on independent audits every year.
