#### MEMORANDUM

## I.1 <u>Approve a Change Order for Concrete and Asphalt</u> <u>Replacement</u> Mr. Sederlund

RECOMMENDED MOTION: "That the Chippewa Valley Schools Board of Education approve a change order to the contractor listed below for concrete and asphalt replacement district wide:"

RATIONALE: This work consists of replacing damaged concrete and asphalt throughout the district at the main public entry paths and other critical areas. An assessment of the paving conditions was completed last fall and this spring. The contractor listed above provided unit pricing with their bid proposal.

This was reviewed with the Building and Site Sub-Committee on Monday, June 1, 2015 and funding will come from the 2010 Building & Site Fund.

## I.2 Approve 2015/2016 Breakfast Program Mr. Sederlund

RECOMMENDED MOTION: "That the Chippewa Valley Schools Board of Education approve the Breakfast Program for the 2015/2016 school year as follows:"

Buildings with Free/Reduced applications totaling less that 20% of enrollment in October 2014 be exempt from offering a breakfast program that is in compliance with applicable regulations in 2015/2016. Buildings with applications totaling more than 20% of enrollment in October 2014 that are mandated to offer a breakfast program in 2015/2016 are Clinton Valley Elementary, Cherokee Elementary, Fox Elementary, Huron Elementary, Miami Elementary, Ojibwa Elementary, Ottawa Elementary, Erie Elementary, and Algonquin and Wyandot Middle Schools.

RATIONALE: School districts are mandated to offer a breakfast program that is in compliance with USDA and State of Michigan regulations in all buildings unless the district determines after conducting a public hearing to not offer the breakfast program in buildings where free and reduced price applications total less than 20% of building enrollment. Chippewa Valley Schools has not offered the mandated breakfast program in elementary buildings with less than the 20% criteria because of projected low participation, which makes the program not economically feasible.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that no Board of Education member or employee of the school district shall expend any funds or obligate the expenditure of any funds except pursuant to appropriations made by the Board of Education and in keeping with the budgetary policy statement hitherto adopted by the Board. Changes in the amount appropriated by the Board shall require approval by the Board.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Superintendent and his designee are hereby charged with general supervision of the execution of the budget adopted by the Board and shall hold the department heads responsible for performance of their responsibilities within the amount appropriated by the Board of Education and in keeping with the budgetary policy statement hitherto adopted by the Board.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that 8.64 mills be certified for levy on all property in the district for the purpose of retiring principal and interest on the voted debt of the district.

This appropriation act resolution is to take effect on July 1, 2015.

RATIONALE: The Uniform Budgeting and Accounting Act requires that governmental units including school districts adopt a budget prior to the start of the fiscal year. The 2015-16 budgets for the General Fund, Food Service Fund, Building Activities Fund, and the Macomb International Academy Fund have been prepared by the administration.

The revenue budget for the General Fund has been developed using major factors including:

- 1. a decreased enrollment projection of 100 pupils,
- 2. a foundation allowance of \$7,391 per pupil (net increase of \$50 per pupil) shown as follows:
  - a. increase of \$140 per pupil in the foundation allowance,
  - b. the equity payment now factored in as a part of the foundation allowance,
  - c. discontinued best practice funding of \$50 per pupil,
  - d. discontinued student performance funding of \$40 per pupil,
- 3. an increase in At-Risk funding by approximately \$27 more per pupil,
- 4. a continuation of MPSERS Cost Offset funding, section 147a,
- 5. recording of retirement offset revenue funding section 147c funding increasing from 7.63% to 10.53%, and
- 6. review and adjustment of other items as appropriate

The expenditure budget for the General Fund has been developed using major factors including:

- 1. the impact of settled employee group contracts with the exception of any revenue over expenditure distribution as provided in the labor agreements,
- 2. the impact of increased hard cap limit under PA 152 for health insurance benefits and cash in lieu of health,
- 3. the impact of increased health insurance benefits due to employees qualifying and enrolling under the Affordable Care Act,
- 4. recording of retirement offset expenditure funding section 147c funding increasing from 7.63% to 10.53%, and
- 5. review and adjustment of other items as appropriate.

In summary, we have General Fund projected revenues of \$149,000,344 and projected expenditures of \$148,323,940 for an operating surplus of \$676,404.

#### I.5 Approve GASB 54 Resolution

RATIONALE: GASB has issued standards on how fund balance is to be classified and reported. Adoption of the resolution identifies the considerations related to GASB 54, designates "Committed" fund balance, and gives authorization for designating "Assigned" fund balance.
