





On October 31st, we welcome your family to join in on our Halloween celebration. Students will participate in classroom parties during the course of the day and will end with our school-wide **Halloween Parade beginning at 10:30 am**. We are hoping to hold the parade outdoors, weather permitting.



Please take a moment to review important information regarding activities and costumes:

Classroom Parties: These celebrations will be held throughout the school day. <u>Parents</u> working the classroom parties will need to have signed up in advance with the classroom teacher. Parent volunteers will need to sign-in with a photo-ID at the front entrance in order to receive a name badge before proceeding to the classroom.



School-wide Parade: All families are welcome to join us for the afternoon parade and will not need to check-in at the office. Parents and family members wishing to view the parade will have the best opportunity to do so by lining up along the playground and bus loop (see attached map). Please wait along the edges of the sidewalk so our students can parade around the perimeter of the school. Once students have circled the building, they will re-enter the school and line

the hallways to watch their peers. Only students will be permitted back into the building after the parade.

In the Event of Rain: Family members will be welcome to sign in at the Media Center and proceed to the gym and Wildcat Den to view the parade if the weather is poor. Entrances will be closed 10 minutes after parade begins in order to ensure our children's safety.

**Costumes:** Please remember when making decisions about Halloween, costumes should represent a non-violent, friendly theme and should not promote violence. Costume accessories such as spears, play-guns, or weapons of any kind should not be brought to school. Since Halloween will be a ½ day of school, students can wear their costume to school in the morning. Masks should not be worn at school. Remember, large accessories are not permitted on the bus. Please help your child plan a costume appropriate for our school parties and parade.


**Dismissal:** Teachers will be dismissing students directly following the parade. If you would like to sign-out your child, you can meet teachers and students outside the dismissal areas listed below. Teachers will have sign-out forms available. Any students not signed-out will be dismissed at the regular dismissal time.

- <u>Kindergarten</u>: Students will be dismissed directly from the access doors of their classrooms.
- First Grade: Door 18 (1st Grade AM line-up area)
- Second/Third Grade: Main Entrance (2<sup>nd</sup>/3<sup>rd</sup> grade AM line-up area)
- Fourth Grade: Door 4 (4th Grade AM entrance area)
- Fifth Grade: Door 5 (5th Grade AM entrance area)


Journeys is an online ELA curriculum that will used by all elementary students. Follow the directions below to access Journeys at home.



#### How do I get free Office 365 ProPlus?

## Frequently Asked Questions – For Students

#### What does Office 365 ProPlus include?

Office 365 ProPlus comes with a full version of Office and familiar Office applications like Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Outlook, OneNote and more. Office 365 ProPlus is a user-based service and allows each student to install on up to five PCs or Macs, and five tablets (iPad or Android) and access Office mobile applications on iPhone and Android phones. (Office Mobile applications are included with all Windows phones). More information here.

#### Do I get anything else besides Office 365 ProPlus when I use the self-service process?

In addition to having access to the Office ProPlus client which has application like Word, Excel, PowerPoint and OneNote, which work across your PCs and Macs, you can active the clients on your iPad, iPhone, Android tablet and Android Phone, giving you access to edit and review your homework on the go. You also get 1 TB of storage through OneDrive for Business to ensure you access to all of your documents whenever you need them. If you using a computer that doesn't have Office installed, don't worry you can edit or review those assignments in Office Online in any browser.

#### What devices can I use Office 365 ProPlus on?

Office supports PCs and Windows tablets running Windows 7 or higher, and Macs with Mac OS X 10.6 or higher. Office for iPad can be installed on iPads running version 7.0 or higher. For information about mobile devices, visit <a href="https://www.office.com/mobile">www.office.com/mobile</a>.

#### What happens when I graduate?

When you graduate, your Office 365 subscription through your institution ends upon graduation. You may enroll into other consumer or commercial offers available. If you have Office 365 Education at your school, you should make sure to transfer all your files from your school OneDrive to your personal OneDrive prior to graduation.

#### Can students install Office for iPad through this Office 365 ProPlus benefit?

Yes, this would count towards the limit of installing it on 5 tablets. Just install the applications and sign in with your school ID.
