This past March marked the final NWEA MAP Growth test window for the school year. In the next couple of days, you will receive a paper copy of the spring 2021-22 NWEA MAP Growth "Student Progress Report" from your child's school.

The data from this most recent assessment administration provides information about the growth your student has made this academic year and allows us to plan for the remainder of this school year and the beginning of next school year.

Our teachers, schools, and district use MAP results to:

- Monitor student growth over time
- Guide classroom instruction
- Determine appropriate courses, interventions, and supports
- Adjust curriculum and teaching practices

Parents can use MAP results to:

- Monitor a child's growth over time
- Help children set and work toward goals
- Identify a child's relative strengths and opportunities for improvement
- Utilize personalized web-based learning activities at www.khanacademy.org

You will see in the MAP Student Progress Report that achievement is reported as a RIT score, which does not correlate to percent correct or a grade. Instead, this spring 2021-22 RIT score provides a snapshot of where your child is educationally at that moment in time and the growth that has been achieved from September to March.

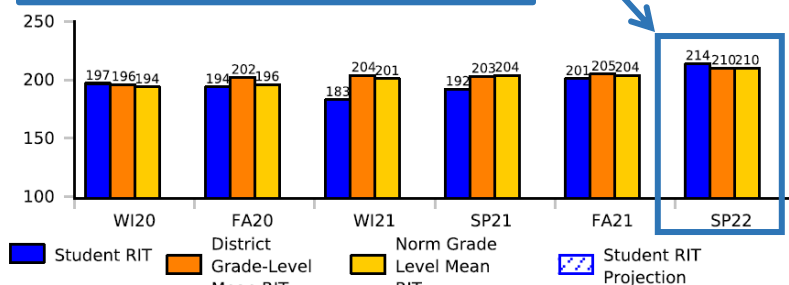
Spring Scores
