### **Immunizations**

Schools in Michigan are required to assess and report the immunization status of all 6<sup>th</sup> grade students. In the fall of 2012 all 6<sup>th</sup> graders must have documentation showing they have had the following immunizations:

Complete series of: DtaP/Td with one dose in the last 5 years Three doses of polio Two doses of MMR Three doses of Hepatitis B One dose of Meningococcal Conjugate (at age of 11) Two doses of Varicella vaccine (chicken pox) or documented history of the disease.

All doses must be given at appropriate ages and must be spaced properly. This requirement will help assure that school-aged children are up-todate and protected against vaccine-preventable diseases. All fifth grade parents have received a letter, with documentation (in green), from the Chippewa Valley Board Office regarding these requirements. Please return the completed, signed documentation to the Fox office as soon as possible. **Students must have one dose of each vaccine by the first day of middle school or they will be excluded.**

# Dress Code



As warm weather approaches please adhere to the following guidelines:

- On **May 1**<sup>st</sup> students are allowed to wear shorts that are fingertip length. Short-shorts are not permitted.
- FLIP FLOPS are strongly discouraged.
- Sunglasses and hats are **not** permitted in school.
- Tank tops must have straps that are 2 fingers wide..
- Undershirt type shirts are not permitted.
- Tops may not expose an area of the midriff or hang off the shoulders.
- Halters and tank tops are NOT acceptable.
- Sagging or extremely baggy pants are not acceptable.

Shorts that are considered "too short" are unacceptable, as are skirts and skorts that are "too short". Recommended length is mid-thigh or at least fingertip length. Sandals are very dangerous on the playground; tennis shoes are a much better choice. Also, no sunglasses, hats or bandanas are permitted in school.

We ask that each family exercise good judgment with regard to their child's appearance.



#### **Immunization Requirements**

The State of Michigan requires all students to be properly immunized. Failure to provide the office with proof of proper immunization documentation may result in exclusion from school. If you have any questions, please call the office at 723-5600. During the year the Macomb County Health Department

visits the school and tests for vision and hearing.

Medication Policy (forms are available in our office and on-line @ www.chippewavalleyschools.org)

- Chippewa Valley Schools provides a form and requires written instructions from the physician before any **Prescription** medication, is dispensed.
- A form is necessary for **over-the-counter medications** that will be dispensed at school.
- All medication **MUST** be in the original container or packaging.
- Containers or packaging **MUST** be labeled with the child's name, medication, dose and time.
- Medications brought to school in other containers will **not** be given to the student.
- Information on the use and adverse effects of any medication given in school should be provided to the school by the parent, pharmacist or physician.
- All medications MUST be transported to and from school by parents only and include the proper forms.

- Please remember that all visitors must report to the office.
- Sign in and pick-up visitors pass.
- This pass must be worn while you are in the building.
- At the conclusion of your visit, please stop by the office to sign out.
