Learning Corner: Fox staff and students continue to monitor our School Improvement Goals. (reading, Writing, and Math). Please discuss these areas with your student and their teacher. The Home / School Learning Support include programs that your child can access at home. These programs are available to support classroom learning.

Student Learning Goals

Math Focus: *Draw a Picture* is where students draw a picture to help visualize a mathematical situation.

Make systemic List is where students make a list to help them to see different ways to solve a problem.

Reading Focus: reading the words correctly but reading with smoothness and proper expression while acknowledging sentence punctuation. Fluency is a combination of skills that come together to reinforce reading comprehension.

Writing Focus: Expository writing is a type of writing where the purpose is to inform, describe, explain, or define the author's subject to the reader. Key words such as first, after, next, then, last, before that, and usually signal sequential writing.

Home / School Learning Support

IXL is a practice Math environment in which guessing is not an option, and success is earned through hard work and genuine understanding of each concept. Students can log in and work at home.

RAZ-Kids is an interactive reading tool for our students to practice reading fluency and comprehension. Students can log in and read at home.

Notes about Notes from the Pupil Transportation Department

On rare occasions, it may be necessary for a student to ride home on a different bus than the one that is assigned to them. During prior years, it has been our practice to accept notes from both sets of parents involved (both sending and receiving) allowing one student to ride home with another student at the Building Principal's discretion either for play dates or homework help, or at times, for daycare purposes. As budgets get tighter and gas prices rise, our ridership continues to increase making it more and more difficult to 'guarantee' that only 2 students will share a seat on the bus.

In an effort to maintain as reasonable a number of students on a bus as possible, the Pupil Transportation Department can no longer support the practice of students casually riding on another student's bus whether they have a note or not. We feel it is important that only eligible students ride buses and that they ride only the bus to which they are assigned.

We understand that situations will arise that may make it necessary for students to ride on a different bus and can certainly support exceptions. For instance, we would ask that in situations where parents may be out of town for a period of time, that they use the Alternate Address Busing form.

In cases where students are working on a project together and must ride home together for that purpose we would ask that parents contact the Pupil Transportation Department prior to the day this needs to occur to determine if there is room on the bus.

It is important that we know who is riding our buses.

We thank you for your understanding and cooperation as we strive to continue to safely and efficiently transport your students to and from school each day.



Dear Parent or Guardian,

We would like to inform you that an Integrated Pest Management (IPM) approach for controlling insects, rodents, and weeds will be used at Chippewa Valley Schools. The IPM approach we will be using focuses on making the school building and grounds an unfavorable place for pests to live and breed. Through maintenance and cleaning, we will reduce or eliminate available food and water sources, and hiding places for the pests. We will also routinely monitor the school area to detect pest problems and prevent the pests from becoming established. Some IPM techniques we will employ include monitoring, increased sanitation, sealing entry points, physically removing the pest and modifying storage practices.

From time to time, it may be necessary to use chemicals to control a pest problem. Chemicals will only be used when necessary and will not be routinely applied. When chemicals must be used, the school will try to use the least toxic products when possible. Access to treated areas will be secured against unauthorized access for the period specified on the pesticide label. Notices will be posted at the application sites and will remain there until the posted safe re-entry time is met.

For your information, we have a list of pesticides and material safety and data sheets (MSDS) that may be used in the school this school year. This list may be obtained by contacting the IPM Coordinator/Chippewa Valley Schools Custodial Supervisor at (586) 723-2253.

Parents or guardians may request prior notification of specific pesticide applications made at the school. To receive notification, you must be placed on the notification registry. After October 1, 2011 the registrants will be notified at least 72 hours before a pesticide is applied. If a chemical application must be made to control an emergency pest problem, notice will be provided as soon as possible after the application. Exemptions to this notification include cleaners (disinfectants), baits and gels, and any EPA exempt pesticides. If you would like to be placed on this registry please complete and return the enclosed form.

- All medication MUST be in the original container or packaging.
- Containers or packaging MUST be labeled with the child's name, medication, dose and time.
- Medications brought to school in other containers will not be given to the student.
- Information on the use and adverse effects of any medication given in school should be provided to the school by the parent, pharmacist or physician.
- All medications MUST be transported to and from school by parents only and include the proper forms.
