If you are driving your child to school, the drop-off/pick-up area is in the back of the building near the tennis courts at door #15. Please be aware that the circle drive in front of our building is designated for buses before and after school. With our growing student population and traffic congestion, we greatly appreciate your cooperation by following the drop-off/pick-up procedures. This year, you will notice our parking lot has been striped to assist with our drop off/pick-up procedures. If bussing is offered to you, we strongly encourage your child to ride the bus.

If you need to drop your child off prior to the start of school, the doors will be open at 7:15AM. Students who are dropped off early, will proceed to the Cafeteria where they will be supervised and have the opportunity to eat a healthy breakfast.

I encourage every parent to sign up for School Messenger this fall. This can be done through Parent Portal and will enable you to receive email and/or text messages whenever important information needs to be distributed. In addition, our daily announcements are sent through this format to keep parents up-to-date. Registration will only take a few minutes and can be done from your home computer. If you have provided your e-mail address on the Emergency Data Verification form, you are automatically enrolled for e-mail messages.

#### From the Desk of the AP

Welcome back Panther Nation! We are eager to hear all about your summer adventures and get this school year started.

#### PANTHER PROWL FUNDRAISER

Our annual fundraiser is tentatively scheduled Thursday, October 13th. The Prowl is the only school-wide fundraiser for Iroquois. Proceeds from this event help fund field trips, activities, equipment, guest speakers, and more. Other fundraising events held at school will benefit outside charities, but only the Prowl directly benefits the students of Iroquois. We are always looking for volunteers to help coordinate and work this event. More details coming soon!

#### QUICK TIPS FOR FOLLOWING SCHOOL RULES

- Upon arrival to school, students should safely pack away their backpacks and purses in their lockers. These items are not allowed to be carried during the day.
- Cell phones We understand the need to communicate with our children, but cell phones are not needed during the instructional school day. Cell phones should be stored in student lockers during instructional hours.
- Classes begin promptly at 7:58AM, but students should arrive a few minutes early to organize their day. We recommend all students to ride a bus if it is available to them. Students being dropped off should arrive to school with enough time to get organized for class.
- Please be mindful of our district's dress code policy as you shop for new school clothes. Our dress code can be found in the student code of conduct on the Chippewa Valley webpage. Here is an abbreviated list of prohibited clothing and items. Please see the Code of Conduct for more details.
  - \* No skirts or shorts that do not extend to at least the mid-thigh.
  - \* No garments/shirts that do not cover the shoulders (the "three finger rule" is a myth).
  - \* No hats or hoods are permitted during the school day.

#### ATTENDANCE AND TARDIES

Good attendance is strongly linked to academic success. Adversely, students who miss school frequently or arrive late to school and classes earn much lower grades then their peers. Iroquois Middle School strongly enforces the district's attendance policies. Students with high numbers of absences from school will be referred to the Macomb County Truancy Department who will meet with family members to investigate the reasons for poor attendance.

Tardiness to class is also strongly enforced. Adequate time is given between classes for students to gather materials, use the restroom, or get a drink. Students with excessive tardiness during the school day will be place on a time management behavior plan which may include limited or supervised passing time.

#### AFTER SCHOOL EVENTS

Iroquois encourages students to attend after school events as spectators. Enthusiastic spectators help to build school spirit and encourage students who are participating in the events. However, attendance as spectators at these events is a privilege, not a right. Students may be prohibited from attending for academic or behavioral concerns.

In addition, students are not allowed to leave and return to school property before or during an event. This includes walking to 7-Eleven.

#### PARKING LOT POLICY

First and foremost, we recommend that all students take their assigned bus to school. For parent drop-off, all students MUST be dropped off and picked up at the rear of the building (near tennis courts). Stay in the line, follow the traffic pattern, and have students exit cars on the curb side. Please do not allow your student to walk through the parking lot or across the drive lines during arrival or dismissal. This creates unsafe situations for students and drivers. Thank you for your cooperation.

We strive to make Iroquois a place where all students feel safe and free to be themselves. They are not going to like everybody or everything, but we strive to help students see and protect the *human* side of every person. That's Iroquois Cool!

We wish everyone a happy, healthy, and successful start to the 2022-23 school year.

#### **Medication Administration in School**

We feel this is a good opportunity to reinforce some of the key points in the Chippewa Valley School District Medication Administration Policy. The purpose of the policy is to support the health needs of children during school hours and to ensure the safety of all children. Key points to remember are:



- Before any medication can be administered in school, written authorization from the child's physician and parent must be obtained and be on file in the school office. Separate forms are available in the main office for prescription and non-prescription medications.
- \* All medication should be brought to school by the child's parent/guardian. Students cannot bring medication to school.
- \* All medication should be in the original bottle or container. Medication not in the original bottle cannot be administered.
- Containers should be labeled with the child's name, medication, dose, time and route.
- \* Information on the use and adverse effects of any medication given in school should be provided to the school by the parent, pharmacist, or physician.
- Parents must notify school personnel if their child has conditions such as allergies, diabetes, or asthma, so that proper precautions/training may be put in place.

Making sure that your children are safe and healthy is our primary concern. If you have any further questions, please feel free to contact our Health Aide at 586-723-3778.

#### STUDENT MESSAGES AND DELIVERIES

If your child has called home because they have forgotten their lunch money or any other item needed for the day, please bring it to the main office. Please encourage your child to leave a message as to why they are calling if you are not available to answer their call. The office staff is not always aware of why a student is calling home and we are not able to interrupt classrooms during class time. Students are aware it is their responsibility to pick up the item from the office, so please remind them to check in the office. Lunches that are not picked up in the office are put on the stage in the cafeteria to be picked up during lunch time. When a delivery is unexpected, it will be forwarded to your child at a time when it may least disrupt class time. Items dropped off for after-school athletics will be placed in an athletic bin in the front office and will be available for pick up at lunch time and after school.

\*\*PLEASE TRY TO MAKE EVERY EFFORT TO HELP YOUR CHILD REMEMBER THEIR THINGS FOR THE SCHOOL DAY. IT IS DISRUPTIVE TO YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING DAY IF WE HAVE TO CALL THEM TO THE OFFICE TO PICK UP THINGS OR CONTACT YOU. If you must deliver lunches, notebooks, money, etc., <a href="PLEASE">PLEASE</a> make sure your child's name and grade are clearly marked on the item. This helps to ensure proper delivery of items.



#### Due to crowded buses, students are NOT allowed to ride a friend's bus home after school.

The Transportation Department thanks you for your help in this matter.

Also, please be reminded that ALL requests for alternate bus stops, exceptions or special arrangements must be renewed **EACH** year with the Transportation Department. Please complete and submit an Alternative Bus Stop Request Form if you require transportation to and/or from a location other than that which you would be assigned based on your home address. All requests from last year have been deleted from the database. Transportation forms can be found at the Iroquois office or at:

# HIGH SCHOLARSHIP AND PRESIDENTIAL AWARDS

To qualify for the annual **High Scholastic Award** at the end of the school year, a student must achieve a 3.50 grade point average or higher for the first three marking periods of the current school year. This is available to all 6th, 7th and 8th graders.

To be awarded the **Presidential Academic Achievement Award**, an
8th grader must have achieved a grade
point average of 3.50 or higher in <u>each</u> of
the first 11 quarters of middle school.

To be awarded the **Panther Award**, an 8th grader must have achieved a 3.95 grade point average or higher for the first 11 quarters of middle school.

Please keep in mind that grade point averages are not rounded up. For example, a GPA of 3.49 is not rounded up to a 3.50. This process follows the same protocol followed by high schools and colleges.

## APPROPRIATE SCHOOL FASHION



- Shorts, skirts/skorts must be below middle fingertip length when a student's arm is extended at their side.
- NO short shirts showing undergarments or exposing the waistline while in the standing or sitting position.
- •Pants **MUST** be worn at the waistline.
- NO bandanas are allowed in school even if the girls wear them to hold their hair back (they should use regular headbands - not bandanas folded up).
- All sleeves MUST cover the shoulders with a full hand's width.
- •NO hats can be worn in school.
- NO tank tops are allowed, but may be worn ONLY IF it is being covered at all times by an appropriate shirt.
- •Shoes must be worn at all times.
- Ripped clothing, such as jeans, should not expose undergarments and rips must be below middle finger tip length.
- •NO clothing made of see-through material.
- •NO muscle shirts.
- NO clothing advertising tobacco, alcohol, or drugs may be worn in school.
- NO clothing containing designs/pictures/symbols or language that are sexually suggestive, vulgar or profane are allowed in school.

### IMPORTANT PROCEDURES (Please Read and Save)

ABSENCE REPORTING PROCEDURE - ALL absences, including illness and vacations, should be reported to the main office by calling the attendance line. The office will then notify the teachers. ABSENCES should be called in before 8:00AM to 586-723-3799. Please leave the student's name, grade level, reason for absence and length of absence on the absence line. We are required to report illnesses to the Macomb County Health Department and must be advised of any illness, especially if contagious. It is also important to call the attendance line when your child is going arrive to school late.

**EMERGENCY INFORMATION** - Please make sure your child's Emergency Information is up-to-date throughout the year with current emergency phone numbers and authorized persons for picking up your child in case of illness. If a child becomes ill during the day, we need to have a working telephone number to reach someone.



HOMEWORK - If your student is absent, please have them check Schoology for homework assignments. If your student has a question regarding an assignment when they are absent, they can contact their teacher through Schoology, e-mail or by phone. For students going on vacation, make-up work should be requested the day they return from vacation. Make-up work should be completed within the same number of school days as he/she was absent, unless special arrangements have been made with each teacher.

<u>EARLY DISMISSAL PROCEDURE</u> - When a child needs to leave school early, parents should come into the school to sign the child out. Children will **only** be released to persons in their emergency information with a valid picture ID. If the student returns to school, the student should come into the office to sign back in and get a pass to return to class. Parents do not need to come back into the school when returning the child to school.

#### **ATTENTION PARENTS**

#### **NSF Checks**

At this time, the fee we are being charged by Comerica Bank for checks that are returned NSF is \$20.00. This is a fee that will be passed on to parents when a check is returned to us.

#### Attention 8th Grade Parents:

Throughout the school year, your student will be taking a series of assessments for placement into high school courses. These tests will evaluate their skills in reading comprehension, algebra readiness and other mathematical concepts. It is ESSENTIAL that parents reinforce the importance of these assessments to their students. Each student must try their personal best so that they can be appropriately placed into high school courses for their freshman year.

#### Free and Reduced Meal Applications:

- \*Applications are available in the school's main office. Applications processed through **www.lunchapp.com** will be process quicker and is the preferred method.
- \*Complete only ONE application per family, even if your students attend school in different buildings within the district.
- \*Students who were on the program at the end of the 2021/2022 school year will remain on the program through

Friday, October 14, 2022. Carryover students who wish to remain on the program after October 14th. MUST submit a new application prior to that date or all meal benefits will be stopped.

- \*Students who receive a pre-approved letter in the mail do NOT need to submit an application.

#### SPECIAL LUNCHES

Please keep in mind that if you bring lunch for your student, you are not permitted to bring lunch for the entire lunch table. Also, if you are bringing your student a special birthday lunch, please refrain from bringing flowers and/or balloons with the lunch. They cannot be in the cafeteria, it is hard to fit them in the lockers and they are not allowed on the bus. Therefore, those items end up remaining in the office until the end of the day.



#### Just a friendly reminder ...

- Any cologne or perfume, spray or otherwise, is <u>strictly</u> prohibited in school. We have students that are allergic to these fragrances, so your cooperation in this matter is appreciated.
- Locker decorating can be done prior to school, only between 7:30-7:50AM. Also, students must bring all supplies with them to school as the office will not provide supplies.
- When bringing items to personalize your locker, please do not use any tape or contact paper on the inside of the locker. This causes the lockers to jam and also leaves the custodians with a difficult time cleaning the lockers in the summer. Also keep in mind, placing anything near the edges of the locker door will also cause the locker to jam.



#### PARENT/TEACHER CONFERENCES

Parent/Teacher conferences will be held on October 5 from 5:30-8:00PM and October 6 from 11:30AM-2:00PM and 5:30-8:00PM. These conferences are held to help with communication between parents and teachers. Here are a few questions you may want to consider asking your child's teachers about his/her progress thus far:

- Does my child turn in homework regularly?
- Does my child work well with others in the classroom?
- Does he/she participate in class by volunteering to answer questions, share his/her work, etc.?
- Does my child take advantage of the time given to him/her in the classroom?
- Does my child have difficulty with anything in specific?

What are some things about your child that would be helpful for the teachers? Are there any concerns we should be made aware of? Communication is the key piece to the success of your child's education. Let's work together to make this a great year for your child.

#### Communication is the key to understanding...

#### Step 1: Contact the teacher

- Questions or concerns regarding instructional practices or your child's progress should first be directed to your child's teacher.
- Calling or e-mailing a teacher is the best way to contact them. Please understand that they may not be able to answer the
  telephone or respond to an e-mail during school hours. You may need to give them 24 hours to respond.
- Staff member e-mail addresses can be found on the school's website.
- Many misconceptions/misunderstandings can be straightened out by a simple communication to the teacher.

 If you need more information or you still have questions/concerns then contacting your child's counselor is the next step for assistance.

Clinton Twp., MI: From Metro Parkway (16 Mile Road) turn right onto Charter Oaks (Charter Oaks is located off Metro Parkway on the north side of the street—between Moravian and Groesbeck). Turn left on the first street which is Briarwood. School is located behind the houses on the right-hand side..

Anchor Bay North Middle School-52801 Ashley, New Baltimore, MI: Take Romeo Plank to 23 Mile Road and take it past Jefferson into downtown New Baltimore (23 Mile will become Green Street in New Baltimore). Turn left at Washington. The school will be on the right. Turn in the far driveway past the school, follow the service drive past the buses and you should see the back of he gym.

Anchor Bay South Middle School-48650 Sugarbush, New Baltimore, MI: Take I-94 North to Exit 241 (21 Mile Road.) Go East on 21 Mile Road to Sugarbush. Go North on Sugarbush to 2<sup>nd</sup> stop sign (approx. 2 miles) and turn right (East.) Continue until you see the school on right-hand side.

<u>L'anse Creuse East-30300 Hickey, Chesterfield, MI</u>: Go north on Gratiot past 24 Mile Road. Turn right on Hickey Road. The entrance will be on your right.

<u>L'anse Creuse North-46201 Fairchild, Macomb, Ml</u>: Take Hall Road east to Fairchild (Fairchild is the next main street after North Avenue). Go North on Fairchild. The school is right after the railroad tracks. OR, take 21 Mile Road east and turn right onto Fairchild; the school will be before the railroad tracks.

<u>L'anse Creuse South-34641 Jefferson, Harrison Twp., MI</u>: Take 16 Mile Road east to Harper and turn right. Take Harper to Shook Road and turn left. Go over the expressway and after the 2<sup>nd</sup> light veer to the right. Shook changes into Jefferson. The school will be on the west side, ½ mile past the 2<sup>nd</sup> light.

Mt. Clemens Jr. High-161 Cass Avenue, Mt. Clemens, MI: Approximately 1 mile east of Groesbeck. Go to the light and turn right into parking lot.

New Haven Endeavour Middle School-22505 26 Mile Road, Ray, MI: North on Romeo Plank Road. Turn left onto 25 Mile Rd; turn right back onto Romeo Plank Ro. Turn right on 26 Mile Road. The school is on the north side of 26 Mile Road.

<u>Powell Middle School-62100 Jewell.</u> Washington, MI: Take Van Dyke expressway north to 28 Mile Road and turn right. The first stop sign you come to is Jewell Road; turn left on Jewell. Look on the right-hand side for the school.

Richards Jr. High-33466 Garfield, Fraser, MI: It's on Garfield, approximately 1/3 of a mile south of 15 Mile Road on the East side of the street. Richards is on the south side of Fraser High School.

#### Meal Changes for the 22/23 School Year

The federal USDA waivers that allowed school districts to provide breakfast and lunch at no cost to students expired on June 30, 2022. For the 2022/2023 school year, families who do not qualify for free or reduced meals will resume paying full prices for school meals.

If your student qualifies for free or reduced meals, **you must complete the 2022-2023 online application at Chippewavalley.familyportal.cloud** to receive this benefit. Even if you completed the 2021-2022 application, you still need to complete the 2022-2023 application as well. Completing an application is the **only way** to be considered for free or reduced meals next school year.

In addition, Chippewa Valley Schools has made the decision to cover the cost of students that qualify for reduced price meals for the 22/23 school year. This means there will be no charge for breakfast or lunch for all students that qualify for free or reduced meals.

If you do not qualify for free or reduced meals, you may begin depositing money into student accounts at any time to prepare for the cost of school meals next year. Meal prices for the 2022-2023 school year will be \$2.75 for elementary lunch, \$3.00 for middle/high lunch and \$1.55 for breakfast at all grade levels. We have been fortunate to have not changed the prices for the last 9 years.

<u>Chippewavalley.familyportal.cloud</u> is a new website where families can access their student's meal account, add money, manage parental controls and apply for free and reduced meals all in one stop! If you previously had a sendmoneytoschool.com account, use the **same email** when you register to Family Portal and all information will transfer over.
