Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2012-2013 educational progress for Miami Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment and teacher quality. If you have any questions about the AER, please contact Mr. Bulgrin in the school office for assistance.

For 2012-2013, Miami Elementary made significant gains in English language arts and mathematics.

The state has identified some schools with the status of Reward, Focus, or Priority. A Reward school is one that is outperforming other schools in achievement, growth, or is performing better than other schools with a similar population. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap in 30% of its student achievement scores. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

Improvement in the levels of student performance in the areas of math, reading, writing, science, and social studies has been the focus of our school improvement plan filed for the 2013-2014 school year. Our professional development continues to focus on common curriculum maps and assessments at each grade level in these content areas. It is our goal to continue the full implementation of the Common Core State Standards in reading and math, as well as the district provided curriculum for writing, science, and social studies.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

- Miami Elementary School is open to all students that reside in our attendance area, and we also accept Macomb County school of choice students on a limited availability basis as assigned to us by our district office. Currently, we have approximately 550 students enrolled in grades K-5, including an early childhood special education class and 2 Webster classrooms.
- The School Improvement Plan (SIP) for Miami Elementary is based on the AdvancEd criteria approved by the Michigan Department of Education for school accreditation. Staff members have identified goals areas in reading, writing, math, science and social studies, and we continue to work on common strategies that will lead to increased student achievement in all areas.
- Teachers at Miami Elementary participate in team planning activities. In doing so, they consult the Common Core State Standards in planning how to use their resources to cover all the material that students must learn at each grade level. Students are able to receive interventions in reading and math as needed, as well as tutoring before school Monday-Thursday. - Miami Elementary enjoys a high level of parent participation. At our fall 2011 conferences, we had 91% of our parents attend. For the fall 2012 conferences, we had 93% of parents attend. We also have a very active and dedicated Parent Teacher Organization (PTO). We continue to offer many exciting educational and family fun activities for parents, students, and staff members to get involved with the Miami community.

I could not be more pleased with the students, parents, and staff members of the Miami Elementary community. Each year, everyone returns to school refreshed and ready to meet the needs of all our students. We look forward to another rewarding year of educating your children.
