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1:1 Opt-Out Form (Grades 6-12)

Chippewa Valley Schools is excited to provide the opportunity for students to participate in the 1:1 technology initiative. This initiative supports student access to digital resources both at school and home via a device checkout program. Buildings will be checking out laptops to students, just as textbooks are checked out or issued to students. The laptops will remain in the students' possession for use at school and home for the duration of the school year.

We recognize there may be situations in which parents would prefer to provide their child with their own personal device instead of accepting a district-issued device. Parents may opt-out of the district's 1:1 Program as long as the student brings a reliable laptop to school every day that allows the student to complete classroom activities, school work, and tests without disruptions.

A parent who chooses to not to have a district device checked out to their student must sign and return this opt out form to their building. To keep this Opt-Out in effect, you must complete a new form every school year.

Please read the following information carefully. It is agreed and understood that:

- □ Students not accepting a CVS laptop are responsible for bringing their own working device every day in order to participate in classroom activities and complete class assignments.
- □ Tablet devices (iPads, Kindle Fires, etc.), smartphones, and gaming systems are not effective devices in our learning environment. CVS uses Windows 10 devices.
- Assignments or tests will not be modified to accommodate issues with personally owned devices.
- Students are expected to follow all school guidelines and policies when operating their devices at school and/or using school resources. Filtering is in place on our network for personal devices that might be more restricted than district-owned devices.
- □ The district will not provide technical support for students who use their own device.
- □ The district does not accept any liability for personal devices used at school. It is the student's responsibility to properly care for and store the device while at school.
- Students must still accept the terms of the Acceptable Use Policy and adhere to all of policies and procedures outlined in the Technology Handbook.
- Students may request to enter the 1:1 device program at any time by completing the necessary paperwork. Parents/students should contact their home building for more information.
